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Policy on Communicable Diseases

Illness

If a child exhibits any of the following symptoms, he/she should not attend school. If such symptoms occur at school, the child will be removed from the classroom and parents will be called to take the child home.

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|-------------------------------|------------------------------|--------------------------------|
| Severe pain or discomfort | Green or yellow runny nose | Acute diarrhea |
| Episodes of acute vomiting | Fever above 99 degrees | Sore throat or severe coughing |
| Yellow eyes or jaundice skin | Conjunctivitis | Infected skin patches |
| Skin rashes (24 hrs. or more) | Difficult or rapid breathing | Swollen joints |
| Stiff neck | Blood in urine | |

Once the child is symptom free, or has a physician's note stating that he/she no longer poses a serious health risk to themselves or others, the child may return to school. If a child contracts any of the following diseases, please report it to us immediately. The child may not return to school without a doctor's note stating that the child presents no risk to him/herself or others.

Cheder Menachem does not allow any child who has evidence or symptoms of lice to attend school until they have been clear of lice for 24 hours, and can only return to school with a note from a doctor/nurse or lice professional.
